From the Pastor's Desk

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Dear Family and Friends at Felton Presbyterian Church,

"You shall be my witnesses." These words mark the beginning and the heart of the Christian Church. They represent the calling, the purpose, and the potential of church. However, these words also mark the greatest shortcoming in the church today.

Of all the things we are and do as a church today, witnessing to others about our relationship with Jesus Christ is not at the top of the list. According to The Barna Research Group, only 35% of all adult Christians in America actually believe they have a responsibility to share their faith with others. Ninety percent of Christians in the United States have never helped someone else come to faith in Jesus.

And yet, the concept of "witness" is so prominent in the book of Acts. It appears forty-two times. As you read the book of Acts, and in fact the entire New Testament, you come to the realization that the Christian Church is not a club, a humanitarian organization, or an institution.

The Christian Church is a missionary church. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, the Church acts as an extension of Jesus' ministry and proclaims the amazing news that salvation is available to all through faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. This is exactly what followers of Jesus Christ have done throughout history. As the Holy Spirit moved ahead, opening new doors, revealing new implications and defining daring outreaches, the Church has indeed been a witness for Jesus Christ to the "ends of the earth." That is why we are now part of the Christian Church. We can call on the name of Jesus as Savior and Lord because others obeyed and followed Christ. And now the baton is passed to us.

As a church, we have a mission statement. It is to **"bring people into a lifelong relationship with Jesus Christ."** Are we actually doing this? Do we want to do this? We are delighted at Jesus' birth, because we know God is with us. We are inspired by His teachings and miracles. We are overcome by God's love for us when we remember the cross. We are filled with the hope of eternal life when we recall His resurrection from the dead. But when Jesus commands us to go and make disciples and be His witnesses where we live and around the world freeze up. It is as if we believe we have nothing good to share.

The truth is, like so many Christians before us, we are witnesses to the transforming power of God. We all have a story to tell about what God has done to save us through Christ. This is our hope and it is the hope of the world. It is also, no doubt, the best thing that has ever happened to us. Talking about the best things in our lives comes naturally. I have noticed that as a church we don't struggle to talk about our kids, our grandkids, our blessings, our

joys, our vacations, our accomplishments and our recreational activities.

These good things in our lives naturally come to the forefront of our conversations. Witnessing is simply telling other people the good things that God has done in our lives. It is sharing the joy of who God is. We are not called to convict or convert others to Christ. That is God's job. We are simply called to share the story of how God has filled us with joy and given us hope.

Perhaps it would be good to write down some of the ways God has loved you, healed you, and changed your life in Christ so that you will be ready and excited to share your story with those God brings into your life. Together, let's live out our mission. Let's be a church on a mission. Let's bring people into a lifelong relationship with Jesus Christ.


High School meets **Tuesdays** – 7:00-8:30 in the youth room. We are currently going through *The Story* by Randy Frazee in a small group format.
