

PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Church Family and Friends,

The Word of God is an amazing collection of sixty-six ancient manuscripts written by forty different authors (kings, shepherds, tax collectors, fisherman, doctors, prophets, and military leaders, among others) over a period of 1500 years telling one unified story of God working throughout history to destroy the power of sin and death and to redeem and restore His relationship with the human race through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. And as we read this story, with all the individuals, events, miracles, tragedies, victories, promises, laws, commands, poems, songs, letters, and prophecies, we discover that this is our redemption story too. Because of Jesus Christ, the story of our lives finds its meaning, purpose, and significance in this grand and glorious story of God. No wonder King David wrote, *“Oh, how I love your law! I meditate on it all day long. How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth! I gain understanding from your precepts; Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on to my path”.* (Psalm 119)

One of the most exciting things happening in the life of our church this year is the growth of our weekly Bible Studies. In addition to more people taking part in our Sunday morning Worship Services, a growing number of people in our church are excited about reading, studying, and applying God's Word to their daily lives. I hope and pray that you are one of them. Not only that, but I have talked to many who have started to read through the Bible this year or have started a daily Bible reading program. And one of the highlights of my year was teaching the kids who attend our mid-week children's program about the Bible each week and seeing them discover God's Truth. All this is very exciting news in the life of our church (or any church for that matter) because the Bible changes lives. When we read it, it challenges us to think differently about ourselves and the world around us, to see as God sees, and then to do as God says. I pray that we will continue to be a church driven, not by our desires or wants or whatever happens to be a fashionable trend in our culture, but by the Word of God. May we continue to be men, women and children of “The Book”.

This year we have had to say goodbye to several staff members who blessed and enriched our church and our Christ-centered ministry in so many ways. We will miss Amy Mcfeely (and her whole family), her Time with Children messages each Sunday, her patience and devotion to our children, and her passion to reach out to our community and draw families and kids to our church. Jeff Williams took over our Youth Ministry Program two years ago and began developing relationships with teenagers one on one and in group settings. When he left this last fall, Jeff had rebuilt our youth program to a level it was years ago. Jeff's love for our youth, his ability to connect with them on their level, and his passion to teach them about Jesus was evident in everything he did here at our church. He and his family (especially those three energetic kids) will be missed.

PERSONNEL AND ADMINISTRATIVE

The church has been fortunate to have several long term staff members. This includes Pastor Ed Snedeker, Kelly Gibbs (Office Manager), Barbara Lang (Organist), the Deeble's (Friday Office Assistants), Jonathan Bates (Middle School Youth Leader), Joe Phillips (Custodian) and Jeff Juliano (Custodian).

It was with much sadness in 2013 we accepted the resignations of Amy McFeely (Director of Children's Ministries), Jeff Williams (Director of Youth Ministries), & Jenna Coura Whaley. (Music Director).

However, God answered our prayers in sending outstanding applicants for each of these positions.

When a position is open we consult with the ministry team to whom they report, review and revise the job description if needed, and advertize the opening. If there are any different financial requirements we also consult the Finance Committee. God has his own timetable of sending applicants. We review each of the applications and select what seems like the top 2-3 applications to be interviewed. We then setup interviews with Pastor Ed and another from Personnel, usually 2 from the Ministry Team to whom they report, and if they are involved with children or youth, then usu-

ally 2 children or two youth as appropriate. When the interview team totally agrees on the candidate they want, we offer the position to that person.

We had the privilege this year of finding a new Director of Children's Ministries (Rachel Wooden Lockridge), Director of Youth Ministries Worship Leader (Uriah Volinsky), and Choir Director (Michelle Izor).

The committee, with others help, also did the Staff appreciation Sunday.

As we discuss possible leaving Presbyterian Church USA the committee spent many hours reviewing and revising many church policies and forms. (Staff, Sexual Harassment/Sexual Prevention, Fingerprinting Policy, Incident Report Form, Children and Youth Medical Release Form, Parent Authorization Form for youth trips, policy for use of church facilities, etc).

We have also had to deal with the changes brought by The Affordable Care Act. Sometimes we have personnel issues to deal with. Such reports are kept separate.

It has been a pleasure for the Personnel Committee to serve the congregation. We continue to need your prayers for the wisdom to deal with the issues' that arrive.

A gigantic thank you to Kari Deeble who led Operation Christmas Child packing and organization!

GIFTS FOR CHRIST (WILLS AND MEMORIALS)

The duty of this Task Force is to oversee memorial funds received by the church.

The Living Memorial Fund was established over 25 years ago. These funds are held with Synod CD's. The total amount in these funds is \$16,3138. Ninety percent of the interest earned by these CDs is distributed at the end of each year, while 10% is kept and added to the total in the CD accounts.

The Ninety percent of interest earned during 2012 will be given out as follows: \$452.67 to the Building and Grounds for landscaping works on our Church grounds; \$1,518.05 is given to the Mission Team for use in local, national and foreign missions; and \$1062.37 will be for Adult Evangelism in our local Church.

Donations given for specific purposes in remembrance of members or friends are distributed in accordance with the donors' wishes.

A Remembrance Book is maintained in the Sanctuary, listing names of those members who have passed on. Each year on All Saints' Day, the congregation is reminded of members who have passed away the preceding year.
